Local residents to share photos of Cuba trip

The Siuslaw Public Library's Adult Summer Reading "Build a Better World" program continues this month with a trip to Cuba.

On Saturday, June 24, at 1 p.m., in the Bromley Room at the main library in Florence, local residents and frequent travelers Bill Benson and Vicki Sieber-Benson will share their photos and impressions of their recent visit to Cuba.

In early 2016, President Obama eased travel restrictions to Cuba (some of which President Trump recently proposed to be re-impose) to allow individual, "person-to-person" travel.

Rather than having to travel with a group as was required under the decades-long embargo against Cuba, individuals could travel to the Communist country as long as the purpose of the visit fell within a certain

category of interest such as educational, cultural or humanitarian. Tourism as we know it is not allowed under the embargo.

Benson and Sieber-Benson, who are dedicated community volunteers and have traveled to numerous continents, decided to take advantage of this new "person-to-person" opportunity to see the Caribbean island and

its people.

The couple took many photographs while touring Cuba, photos that portray the colorful culture, the art and rhythm of this island nation, and cars from a bygone era.

A sample of their extensive collection of photographs were recently on display in the library. They will share more of their striking and informative

photos, as well as talk about their unique experiences in Cuba — including the funeral of former dictator Fidel Castro, who passed away while they were on the island.

This will be a unique opportunity to journey to an island and meet its people.

This program will appeal to the traveler, the arm-chair traveler and everyone interested in a country "in transition," internally, as well as externally with its super-power neighbor.

There is no charge to attend the event and this opportunity to travel vicariously to Cuba is open to the public.
