
Workshop seating is once again limited to 25.

SWC to receive Fish Creek project grant

The Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB) awarded \$162,300 to the Siuslaw Watershed Council for the Fish Creek Large Woody Debris Placement Project at their April 24-26, 2017 board meeting.

"This project will greatly increase the quantity and quality of Coho winter and summer rearing habitat through the addition of large wood

throughout three miles of Fish Creek," says Eli Tome, Siuslaw Watershed Council Restoration Projects Manager. The project will add approximately 450 pieces of large woody debris to three miles of Fish Creek.

The addition of large wood will help catch gravels and improve stream habitat for Coho salmon. The project is expected to begin in the fall of

2018 and be completed by November of 2019.

Funding for grants awarded by the OWEB Board comes from three primary sources – the Oregon Lottery, Salmon License Plate revenues, and Federal Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery funds.
