Seatbelt 'Blitz' continues next week

Oregon State Police, the Lane County Sheriff's Office Florence Police Department will continue working to increase proper safety belt and child car seat use during a statewide traffic enforcement "blitz" through Monday, Sept. 3. Officers will also be on the alert for persons exceeding the posted speed limit and violating the "hands-free" cellphone law.

A new Oregon law for children under two years old requires they use a child seat with harness in a rear-facing position unless the child turned one year of age prior to May 26, 2017.
