The pies are made in Salem by Willamette Valley Pie Company, and are non-GMO, lower-sugar added and the

crusts are trans fat free.

From freezer to oven, flavors include American Apple, Cherry Crunch, marionberry, raspberry/rhubarb, caramel apple and peach-raspberry streusel.

The specialty holiday pie of the month is Pumpkin Chiffon, a thaw-and-serve dessert.

Large pies are 40 ounces, and 10-ounce mini pies are available too. Large pies are available for \$17, two for \$32 or three for \$45.

Mini pies (packaged six per case) cost \$30 each, two for

\$55 or three cases for \$80.

"Not only will the club kids be taking pie orders and have a chance to win a grand prize for supporting their club by having the most orders, several local businesses and friends have offered to jump in," said Nancy Pearson, who is heading up the fundraiser this year. "My goal is to have the club net at least \$8,000 for our first pie fundraiser. Any amount above that will be a dollop of whip cream on top."

Order forms and information on the pies are now available.

Orders are being taken through Oct. 2, with delivery of the pies scheduled for Oct. 25.

All proceeds go to support after-school programs, athletic programs, SMART Girls, Passport To Manhood, Money Matters, and more for youth in grades K-12.

The Alzheimer's Association Oregon Chapter will be holding a class, "Legal and Financial Planning," from 1 to 3 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 5, in the Bromley Room of the Siuslaw Public Library, 1460 Ninth St.

Participants will have a

chance to learn about important legal and financial issues, how to put plans in place, and how to access legal and financial resources in the community.

"Planning ahead is one of most important things families can do when a loved one is diagnosed with Alzheimer's or another dementia," said Abby Gershenson, Cascade Coast regional coordinator for the Alzheimer's Association.

This program will cover information for families and individuals dealing with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia. Topics covered will

include:

- Making legal plans that fit individualized needs
- Necessary legal documents and what they mean
- How to find legal and financial assistance
- Practical strategies for making a long-term plan of care
- Tax deductions and credits
- Government programs that can help pay for care
