Community Coalition hears about housing, services

The Florence Area Community Coalition welcomes representatives from the Housing and Community Services Agency of Lane County (HACSA) and Siuslaw Outreach Services (SOS) to speak at its monthly meeting on Wednesday, Oct. 4, from 9 to 10:30 a.m., in the Bromley Room of the Siuslaw Public Library, 1460 Ninth St.

HACSA Executive Director Jacob Fox, Public Relations Manager Ela Kubok and Landlord Liaison Travis Baker will describe an overview of the agency's program and services, including information about how landlords can partner with HACSA to better serve Section 8 tenants while protecting their investments.

SOS representative Dianna Huenergardt will talk about the LIHEAP program, which provides assistance to persons in need of subsidies for their electric bills. She will detail the funding, qualifications to

apply, application process and timelines.

There will also be a brief Medicare update and reminder about the Open Enrollment period from Oct. 15 to December by SHIBA representative Suzanne Mann-Heintz.

This month's featured agency is SOS. Participants are invited to donate to LIHEAP.

Bring your business card to the meeting and enter a drawing for a free membership to FACC. The drawing is held each month.

Membership runs from July 1 to June 30, costs \$25 for individuals and \$50 for organizations, and is the lifeblood that enables FACC to provide services to the community, including monthly meetings, scholarship, a volunteer recognition event and an aging in place conference.

Oregon Heritage Commission offers arts grants

The Oregon Heritage Commission is offering grants for qualified projects for the conservation, development and interpretation of Oregon's cultural heritage.

Awards typically range between \$5,000 and \$20,000.

Projects can include anything related to Oregon heritage, and priority will be given to projects that preserve, develop or interpret threatened heritage resources or heritage resources of statewide significance.

The grant application deadline is Oct. 2, 2017.

Projects may include theatrical performances, collections

preservation and access, exhibits, oral history projects, public education events, organizational archives projects, films and more.

Previously funded projects included a variety of projects around the state. Linn County Museum partnered with Oregon Black Pioneers to incorporate African American history in the permanent exhibit. Cascade AIDS Project collected oral histories and made them accessible. Southern Oregon University completed oral histories and made them available online. Concordia University helped present the Vanport Mosaic Festival. Four

"We hope to see a variety of projects that engage Oregonians in heritage," said Kuri Gill, heritage grants program coordinator. "We encourage the documentation, preservation and exploration of all aspects of Oregon's heritage." Applications are submitted online.

Oregon Heritage grants programs staff is happy to discuss projects and review applications in advance.

The Heritage Commission is comprised of nine people representing Oregon's heritage and geographical diversity who

have been appointed by the Governor. There are nine advisory representatives from state agencies and statewide organizations.

The commission's mission is to secure, sustain and enhance Oregon's heritage by ensuring coordination of heritage initiatives by public and private organizations; advocacy on its behalf; education of the public about its extent and value; and promotion and celebration of its diversity.
