VIKING RUNNERS FIRST, SECOND AT PHILOMATH

The Siuslaw cross country team continued its run among the elite last weekend, with the Viking boys placing first and the Lady Viks finishing second in their respective divisions at the Paul Mariman Invitational cross country meet in Philomath.

Of the 13 boys teams, Cottage Grove was the closest to Siuslaw's winning score of 60 points, coming in at 110 points. Fueled by personal records for four out of five team mem-

bers, Siuslaw was led by sophomore Brendon Jensen's fifth-place individual finish in a PR time of 17 minutes, 5.23 seconds. Senior Isaac Griffes was close behind with a PR at 17:17.17, with sophomore Jonah Jarman clocking a personal best of 17:23.35, and sophomore Kiger Johnson coming in at 17:44.89 for a season-best mark.

Senior Jordan Northrop rounded out the top five with a PR of 18:03.01.

In the girls division, 10 teams were on the course as Scappoose took the top

The Viks managed to score twice in the second half while the Pirates posted a field goal to finish with a 45-12 win on the Viks' Homecoming Night.

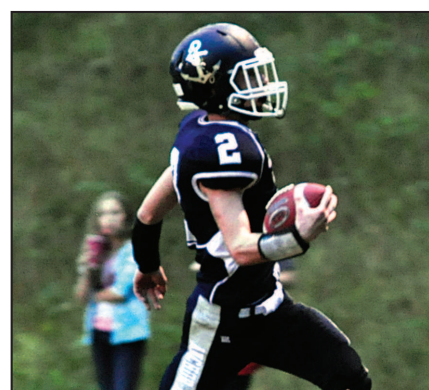

MID COAST LAKES:
Olalla Reservoir has been stocked with about 100 surplus summer steelhead from the Siletz Falls trap, this season. These fish get fairly active in the lake and offer a unique fishing experience.

Once in the lake they are considered "trout" and do not require a Combined Angling Tag. Anglers are reminded, however, that only one trout per day over 20 inches may be retained, and these fish will almost all be in that size range.

Mid Coast lakes been stocked with trout throughout the spring. Trout stocking is over until the fall but there still should be fish around to catch. Water temps are great and fish should be hungry.

SIUSLAW RIVER:
Chinook, trout

Fall Chinook angling continues and fishing is picking up in tidewater. Trout season continues with some nice cutthroat around. Remember the limit on streams and rivers is two per day over 8-inches.

Anglers are reminded the two-rod validation is only valid while angling in standing water bodies excluding coastal lakes
