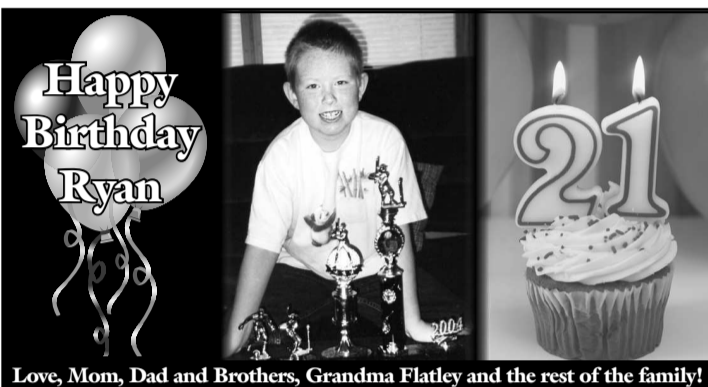

Local firefighters join fight against California wildfires

On Tuesday, Oct. 10, at 11 p.m., Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue sent three firefighters, Kyle Orozco, Tony Miller and Blair Campbell, with one Type I engine with a Lane County strike team consisting of 5 similar apparatus to Santa Rosa, Calif., for structure protection. The crew arrived safely and will be working shifts of 24 hours on, and 24 hours off. "They are working hard and are very appreciative to be able to help," said SVFR Fire Marshal Sean Barrett. "This is the first time in our history we have sent any apparatus to California to help. The situation down there is grim at best." Currently, there are 50 engines from Oregon deployed in northern California. The Lane County crew is expected to stay for 16 days.

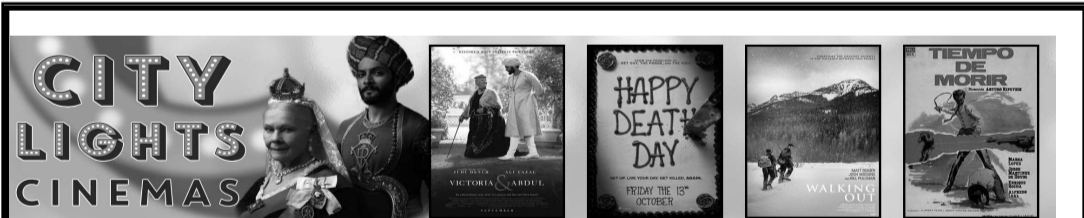
