### Florence Municipal Court Nov. 7

Douglas William Mclean pleaded no contest to criminal trespass and to initiating a false report. He was sentenced to five days in the Florence City Jail. He must pay \$630 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

Daniel Otto Napier pleaded no contest to harassment. He was sentenced to 15 days in the Florence City Jail.

He must pay \$205 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

Fay Vivienne Greco pleaded no contest to harassment. She must pay \$530 in fines and not contact or be in or about the residence or place of employment of the victim.

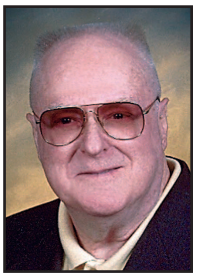
Fred was an avid car and gun collector and enjoyed spending his spare time bowling and practicing at the shooting range.
