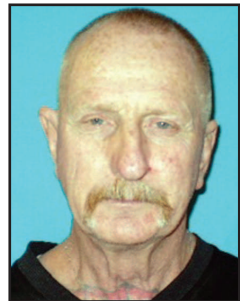

## Police warrant leads to multiple drug-related arrests

On Friday, Nov. 17, at approximately 8:30 p.m., officers with the Florence Police Department, assisted by Lane County Sheriff's Office and Oregon State Police, served a search warrant at the residence of 56-year-old Chuck Wright, 5045 N. Loftus Road.

Wright was charged with unlawful possession of the controlled substance methamphet-

amine, unlawful possession of the controlled substance heroin, and unlawful delivery of the controlled substance heroin.

Wright was lodged in the Florence City Jail and will be transported to the Lane County Jail.

During the investigation, officers identified several other individuals at the residence who had warrants out for their arrest:

- Amber Borjorcas, 31, of Florence, was charged with fre-

quenting a place where controlled substances are used and arrested on a Florence Municipal Court warrant.

Borjorcas was lodged in the Florence City Jail.

- Sarah Larson, 29, of Florence, was charged with frequenting a place where controlled substances are used and arrested on a probation violation warrant and a theft III warrant.

Larson was lodged in the Florence City jail and will be transported to the Lane County Jail.

- Robert Jacob, 43, of Swisshome, was charged with

frequenting a place where controlled substances are used and arrested on a warrant for failure to appear on a charge for unlawful possession of the controlled substance heroin.

Jacob was lodged in the Florence City Jail and will be transported to the Lane County Jail.

- Shawna Earle, 35, of Florence, was cited and released for frequenting a place where controlled substances are used.

The investigation is ongoing with possible additional charges pending.

ing and practicing at the shooting range.

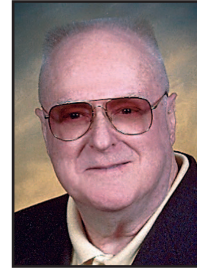
Fred was preceded in death by our beloved mother, Mary Dolores, in 1990.
