

# State Parks gear, parking permits available for holiday giftgiving

This holiday season, give loved ones a year of unlimited access to Oregon's state parks with an annual day-use parking permit. From Dec. 1-31, holiday shoppers can buy the annual parking permit for only \$25, which is \$5 off the regular price of \$30. The permits are transferable from vehicle to vehicle. "Give the gift that will inspire your family and friends to explore the parks

and historical sites that make Oregon special," said Lisa Sumption, Oregon Parks and Recreation Department director. Shoppers can round out their gift with holiday gear branded with the iconic Oregon State Parks shield, including hats, water bottles, dog bowls, ornaments and stickers. The holiday gear will be on sale during the month of December. Gift gear and parking permits are for sale

online at [www.store.oregonstateparks.org](http://www.store.oregonstateparks.org). Gift items can also be purchased in person at Oregon State Parks headquarters in Salem, 725 Summer St. NE Suite C. Parking permits are also sold at major OPRD offices, some state park friends' group stores and selected local businesses throughout the state. back to the parks you love, consider becoming a member of — or giving the gift of a membership to — the non-profit Oregon State Parks Foundation. The Foundation is dedicated to raising funds to enhance the state park experience. Those who give a tax-deductible donation of \$45 or more will receive a 12-month day-use parking pass as a thank you. Parking costs \$5 a day at 26 Oregon State Parks unless you have a 12- or 24-month parking permit or a same-day camping receipt. The 24-month pass is \$50. Visitors are the single largest source of funding for Oregon's state parks. Revenue from RV registrations and the Oregon Lottery, dedicated by voters in 1998 and 2010, make up the rest.

## Crabbing from 1B

health advisory come at a complicated time of year for Oregon's crab fisheries. By rule, Dec. 1 is Oregon's earliest annual start for ocean crabbing, for both commercial and recreational fisheries. However, this year, due to low crab meat yield and elevated levels of biotoxins in

some areas, much of Oregon's ocean area remains closed to crabbing after Dec. 1. Additional testing for meat yield and biotoxin levels will continue at least through the end of December. For both recreational and commercial crab fishermen, below is a simple guide for what is currently open and closed. Before you go crabbing,

please confirm the status of ODFW/ODA harvest areas relative to concerns about elevated biotoxins at the website below. • Recreational crabbing — Currently open in all bays and estuaries that are not under the health advisory; opens after Dec. 1 in ocean areas where biotoxins are below the alert level. • Commercial ocean crab-

bing — Delayed in all areas until at least Dec. 16. • Commercial bay crabbing — Commercial bay crabbing is re-opened in Coos Bay on Monday, Nov. 27; commercial bay crabbing remains closed from the California border to the north jetty of the Coquille River (including the Coquille estuary), and from Tahkenitch Creek to Cape Foulweather. Commercial bay crabbing

remains open at this time in bays and estuaries, and on beaches, docks, piers, and jetties within the areas that are not under the health advisory. • All commercial bay crabbing will be closed as of Dec. 1 along with the delayed season for the commercial ocean fishery, according to existing ODFW rules. This year, the commercial ocean fishery is delayed from Dec. 1 until at

least Dec. 16. Despite the closure, crab and shellfish products sold in retail markets and restaurants remain safe for consumers.
