In addition to his duties as editor of the local newspaper, Hickson is an award-winning syndicated columnist with his weekly offerings of wit and humor appearing in dozens of newspapers in the U.S. and Canada.

He has been awarded "Best Local Column" from both the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association and the Society of Professional Journalists. He is also a published author of two books, "Humor at the Speed of Life" and "Pearls of Writing Wisdom: From 16 shucking years as a columnist."

Prior to launching his career in journalism at the Siuslaw News, Hickson was a corporate chef in Dallas, Texas and Atlanta,

"We are delighted with the design for its vibrancy, local icons, fun elements and its ability to transcend all media," said Bettina Hannigan. "Susan and

Scott captured what we were looking for in celebrating our 111th anniversary and evoke a sense of a exciting gathering."

This year's logo will soon start appearing in print, broadcast and online materials to promote the event and draw visitors to Florence. The logo will be printed on commemorative pins, banners, advertisements and print guides.

The Rhododendron Court will sell pins featuring the logo. Proceeds go toward scholarships for Queen Rhododendra, the King of the Coast, and members of the Rhody Court.

The 2018 Rhododendron Festival will be held May 18, 19 and 20, with preliminary events beginning as early as Wednesday, May 16.

Traditionally the Davis Shows Carnival opens on Wednesday afternoon at the Port of Siuslaw parking lot; the Rhododendron Court coronation takes place Thursday evening at the Florence Events Center; and the town begins filling on Friday.


There is a junior parade on Saturday afternoon and the grand floral parade on Sunday.



Book Review "The Kelloggs: The **Battling Brothers of Battle** Creek" by Howard Markel



one of America's most beloved physicians; a best-selling author, lecturer and healthmagazine publisher; founder of the Battle Creek Sanitarium; and patron saint of the pursuit of wellness. His younger brother, Will, was the founder of the Battle Creek Toasted Corn Flake Company, which revolutionized the mass production of food and what we eat for breakfast.

In "The Kelloggs," the author tells the sweeping saga of these two extraordinary men, whose lifelong competition and enmity toward one another changed America's notion of health and wellness from the mid-nineteenth to the mid-twentieth centuries, and who helped change the course of American medicine, nutrition, wellness, and diet.

The Kelloggs were of Puritan stock, a family that came to the shores of New England in the mid-seven-

teenth century, went west to the wooded Michigan frontier to start a farm that became one of the biggest in the country, and then renounced it all for the religious calling of Ellen Harmon White, a self-proclaimed prophetess, and James White, whose new Seventhday Adventist theology was based on Christian principles and sound body, mind, and hygiene rules - Ellen called it "health reform."

The Whites groomed the young John Kellogg for a central role in the Seventh-day Adventist Church and sent him to America's finest medical school, Bellevue Hospital Medical College. Kellogg's main medical focus-and America's number one malady: indigestion (Walt Whitman described it as "the great American evil.")

Author Markel gives us the life and times of the Kellogg brothers of Battle Creek: Dr. John Harvey Kellogg and his world-famous Battle Creek Sanitarium medical center, spa and grand hotel attracted thousands actively pursuing health and well-being. Among the guests: Mary Todd Lincoln, Amelia Earhart, Booker T. Washington, Johnny Weissmuller, Dale Carnegie, Sojourner Truth, Henry Ford, John D. Rockefeller Jr., and

presidents he advised: Taft, Harding, Hoover, Roosevelt, with first lady Eleanor. The brothers Kellogg experimented on malt, wheat, and corn meal, and, tinkering with special ovens and toasting devices, came up with a readyto-eat, easily digested cereal they called Corn Flakes.

As Markel chronicles the Kelloggs' fascinating, Magnificent Amberson-like ascent into the pantheon of American industrialists, we see the vast changes in American social mores that took shape in diet, health, medicine, philanthropy, and food manufacturing during seven decadeschanging the lives of millions and helping to share our industrial age.
