Hosted by the Viking wrestling team, matches began at 9 a.m. and continued nearly non-stop throughout the day until the championship rounds late that afternoon. When the final medals were handed out and scores were tabulated, seven Viking wrestlers had placed, including a tournament title at 126 lbs. for senior Richard Huff.

Huff pinned all four of his oppo-

nents to sweep the bracket.

Siuslaw had a strong showing from its underclassman-dominated line-up, with freshman Elijah LaCosse placing second at 120 lbs. for the Viks, along with fourth-place finishes for fellow freshmen Brady Libby (113 lbs.) and Ryan Jennings (138 lbs.).
