**WINTER TROUT FISHING**

Don't let your trout fishing season end just because the cold weather has arrived. Here are just some of the weekend opportunities from this week's Rec Report:

- Several ponds and lakes in the Willamette Zone just took delivery of large brood trout.
- In the Southeast Zone, the Ana River has been kicking out trout in the 12- to 16-inch range. The Blitzen also has great year-round fishing.
- Expo and Reinhart ponds in the Southwest Zone were recently stocked with legal and larger trout last week.
- The Central Zone has several popular winter trout fisheries including the Deschutes, Fall and Metolius rivers. Also the Crooked River, which has

Siuslaw's basketball teams kicked off a week on the road last Tuesday, making the long trip to Brookings-Harbor for what undoubtedly seemed like an even longer trip home after losing both match-ups with the Bruins.

The girls opened the double-bill, keeping pace with Brookings-Harbor (2-0) throughout the first half to enter the break with a narrow 1-point deficit.
