The Lady Viks advanced to the finals and secured an undefeated season at 7-0 with a win over Cottage

Grove, 381-323.

Meanwhile, the boys had both their JV and varsity teams in competition after the JV team qualified the previous week at Cottage Grove. The JV team did well, finishing 10th overall. The varsity team stayed among the top

four heading into the the semifinals, where they defeated Marshfield, 345-330 before taking the championship over Springfield, 345-313.
