

Is A Self-Paced, Competency-Based Education Right For You? Here Are The Six Questions You Should Ask Yourself.

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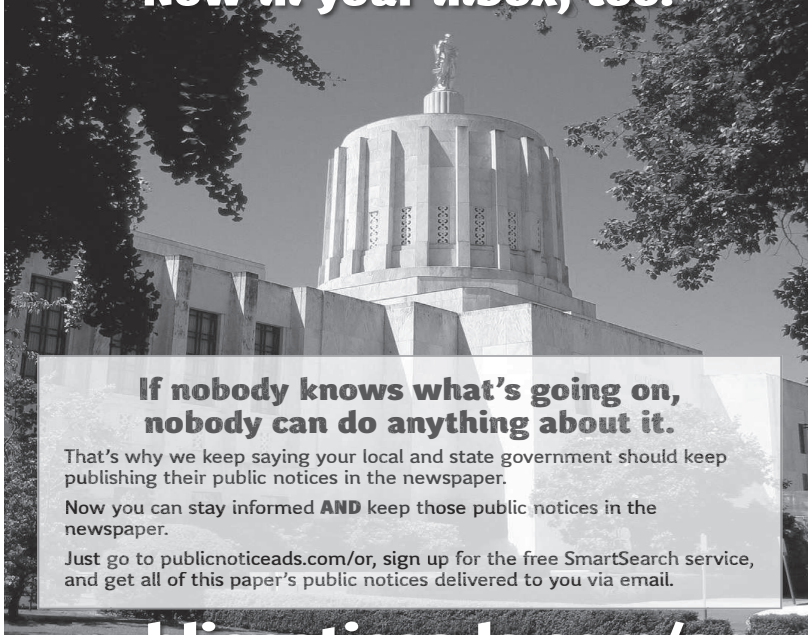

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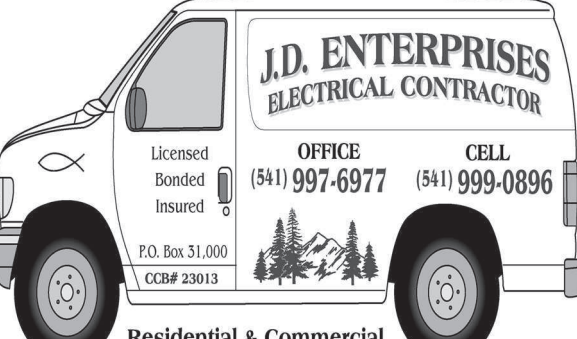
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
