John Quay Heritage Players to perform at the library

The Siuslaw Public Library will host a performance by the John Quay Heritage Players of the Siuslaw Pioneer Museum, a local drama group of talented actors and actresses. The group will appear in the Bromley Room at the main branch of the library in Florence on Tuesday, Feb. 27, at 1 p.m.

The John Quay Heritage Players perform dramatizations of early life in and around Florence. The pioneers of our area are brought to life through monologues delivered by familiar local performing artists. The pioneers represented include Christina Kyle (Cathy DuPont); Lily Cox Hurd (Annie Schmidt); Clara Gamble Hering (first woman on the North Fork played by Alyson Scott); Elizabeth Knowles (Diane Neale); Harvey Hanson (Dorland Neale); and, Dan Johnson aka Indian Dan (David Dumas).

Some of the pioneer names might be familiar: Knowles as in Knowles Creek, and Kyle as in the historic Kyle Building in Old Town Florence.

The troupe will offer personal monologues and enact various fact-based scenes, offering diverse viewpoints of life in the early Florence. Not only will the performance be fun and entertaining, but also educational.

This program will appeal to everyone interested in our area's early pioneering days. Each member of the audience is sure to find a favorite story among those told or depicted during the course of the show.

The event is free and open to the public. As seating is limited, it is suggested attendees arrive early.
