## Japanese Internment exhibit moves to Deadwood

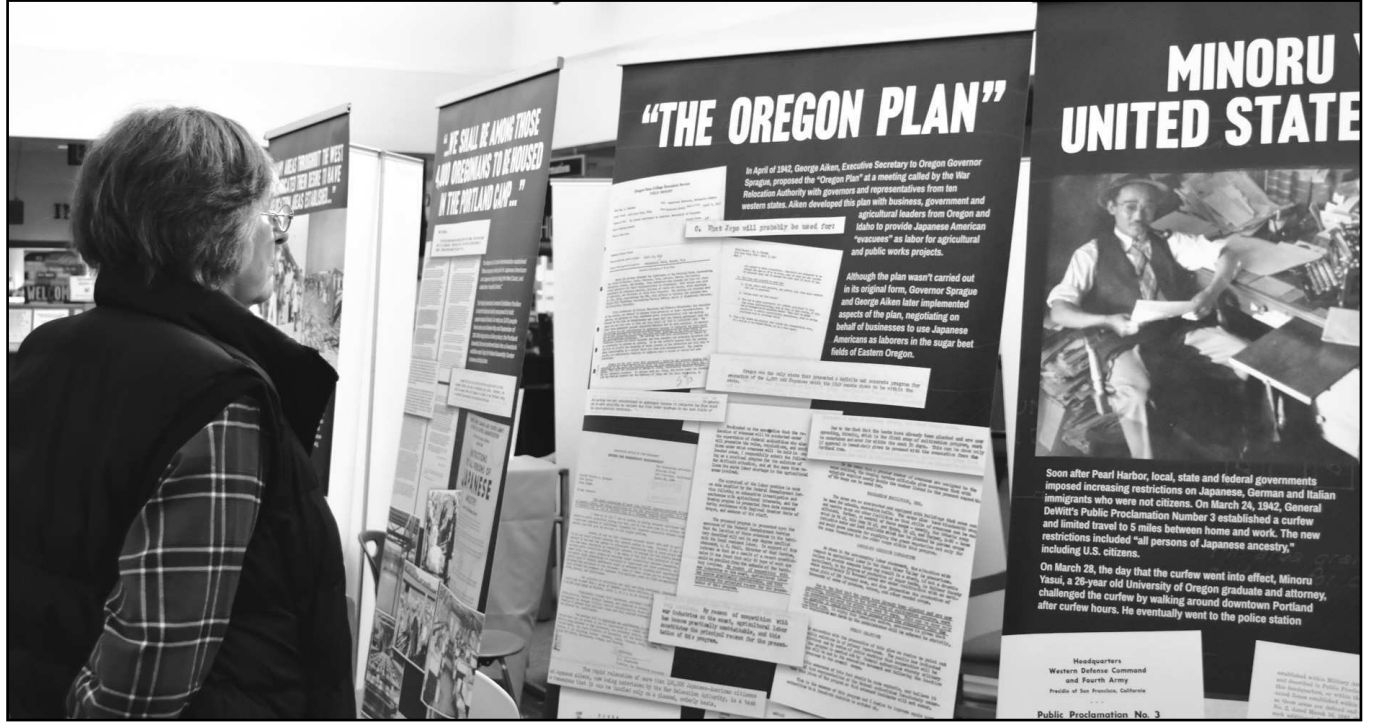

The Deadwood Committee for the Architecture of Internment Exhibit and Deadwood Creek Services will host the exhibit "Architecture of Internment: The Build Up to Wartime Incarceration" today, April 14, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. The exhibit, which had been on display at the Siuslaw Public Library (above), explores how Oregonians participated in the decision to incarcerate Japanese Americans and Japanese immigrants during World War II. At 4 p.m., local author and international diplomacy expert Mel Gurtoiv will present "Who Are We? America's Problematic Treatment of Immigrants." The event will be held at the Deadwood Community Center, located 4.5 miles up Deadwood Creek Rd.
