Multiple PRs anchor Sailors’ track performance

Mapleton track and field was on the road at Crow High School last Thursday, where the Sailors set more than a dozen personal records at the 6-team meet.

On the track, freshman Emily Stevens placed second in the 100-meter dash in 15.42, then won the 100-meter hurdles in 20.92 before landing third in the long jump at 11-10.

Stevens joined fellow freshman Jozzy Roby and sophomores Kaleigh Anderson and Trinity Holmes for a fifth-place finish in the 4x100-meter relay in 1:07.01.

Sophomore Daleena Bender set PRs in both the 200 meters (50.31) and shot put (17-11.5), along with shot put PRs for Holmes (19-06.5) and Anderson (18-10.5) for seventh and ninth place, respectively.

Roby was 10th in the shot put.

In the 800 meters, Holmes finished second with a PR time of 3:21.67. Roby placed second in the 1500-meter race in 7:56.94.

Holmes eventually finished the day

with a personal-best mark in the javelin at 56-0 for eighth place.

The girls placed fifth overall. Host Crow was first with 160 points, followed by McKenzie (86), Alsea (63), Triangle Lake (62), Mapleton (49) and Powers (46).

Suislaw track performance includes new school record in mile event

More than 30 teams were on hand for the Prefontaine Rotary Invitational at Marshfield High School on Saturday, when Siuslaw sophomore Hannah Rannow set a new school record in the girls’ mile race that had remained for 50 years. Rannow’s time of 5:36.0 edged out the fastest time of 5:38.6, which had been held by Sherry Wells since 1968.

The girls mile hasn’t been an official distance event since 1977, but the achievement by Rannow is significant, earning her a place in the Siuslaw history books.

She finished seventh overall in Saturday’s race, with Bandon’s Sailor Hutton blazing across the finish in 5:12.89 for first place.

Rannow also had a fifth-place finish in the 800 meters with a time of 2:31.11.

The Lady Viks also got standout performances from freshman Gracie Freudenthal, who was third in the 300-meter hurdles (50.36) and fourth in the 100 hurdles with a PR time of 17.81; sophomore Anne Wartnik with a PR in the 3000 meters with a PR time of 11:41.45; fifth place for junior Madison Reynolds in the shot put with a mark of 31-8; and seventh place for sophomore Chloe Madden with a PR time of 12:01.05 in the 3000-meter race.

For the boys, sophomore Ryan Rendon-Padilla launched the javelin 161-5 for second place; senior KC Tatum landed fourth in the discus at 126-3; senior Kyle King leaped a

BEST BETS FOR FISHING

- Now is the time to fish for spring Chinook on the Willamette River.
- Spring Chinook fishing closed on the Columbia River April 7, but the season is just beginning to heat up on the Willamette, Rogue, Umpqua and Nestucca rivers, and in Tillamook Bay.

- Spring trout fishing can be excellent. Dozens of locations throughout the state have been or will be stocked with legal-size or larger trout. Some notable examples from this week’s schedule: Foster Reservoir (10,000 fish), Henry Hagg Lake (16,000) and Detroit Reservoir (18,000).

Steelhead

Winter steelhead fishing has improved. Casting spinners, drifting bait or using a bobber and jig can be effective.

BE ALERT TO FISHING REGULATION CHANGES

Fishing regulations can change during the season, especially during popular salmon seasons. To stay on top of the changes, click the yellow “alert” button at the top of the home and Fishing landing pages. You also can check for any regulation updates at the top of each zone of the Recreation Report. (Columbia River spring Chinook seasons at
