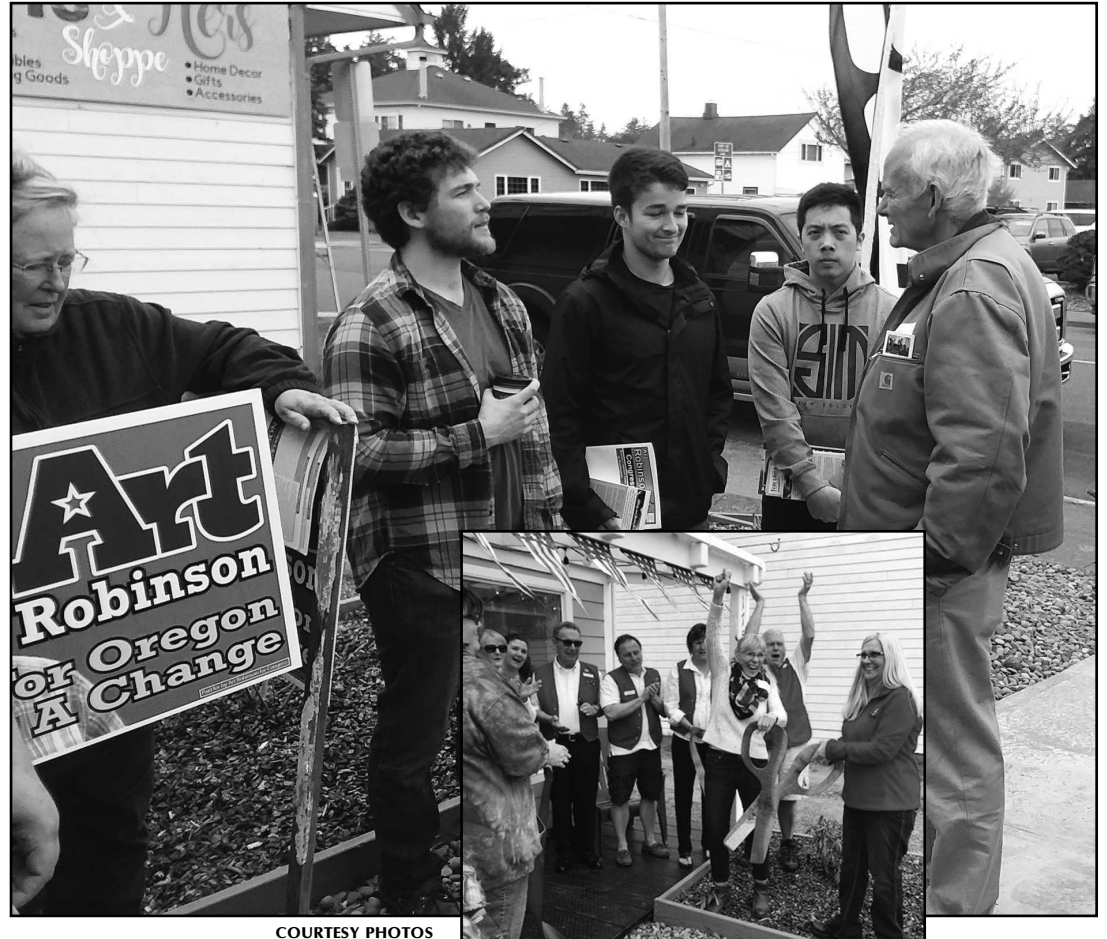
Patriot Place is a gathering place and gift shop staffed entirely by residents volunteering their labor and finances to create a positive meeting place for the community of Florence.

Military Museum to host Heritage Day this Saturday

The Oregon Coast Military Museum will host its Military Heritage Day on Saturday, April 21, beginning at 2 p.m., in the hangar of Sam Spayd at the Florence Municipal Airport.

Southern Oregon Veterans Benefit Member at Large, Russ McBride, himself a Vietnam veteran, will share information about their project that has been in the works for a few

years in Medford.

The memorial wall will be national in focus. Even at 80 percent scale, it will still be 360 feet in length and bear the names of 58,479 Americans (at current count) who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

It will sit on 2.1 acres within the Medford parks system.

McBride will be joined by the Salem sponsor of the Vietnam War Memorial Fund

President Steve Bates, to present the project being planned as a state memorial in Salem. It will not only be an Oregon state focus, but will contain emphasis on multiple components of the veterans' experiences such as MIA/POW, nurses, Agent Orange and other aspects.

The \$1.5 million project, which will be located on the grounds of the state capitol in

Salem, is targeted for completion of Veteran's Day, 2020.

The Oregon Coast Military Museum, 2145 Kingwood St. in Florence, is open to the public Thursday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

FLORENCE DAR CELEBRATES 10TH BIRTHDAY APRIL 27

Oregon Dunes Chapter National Society Daughters of the American Revolution will celebrate its 10th birthday on April 27 with a luncheon meeting at Driftwood Shores.

National Society Daughters of the American Revolution was established in 1890, and has had a presence in Oregon since 1914, when the Multnomah Chapter was formed.

The Oregon Dunes Chapter supports the area's active duty military members and veterans, and is proud to award an annual scholarship to a graduating senior.

In 10 short years the chapter has awarded Community Service Awards to Louis and Pearl Campbell, Taylor Graham and Kaylee Graham.

Local teacher Marsha Klosterman was recognized at the Oregon State Society Conference as History Teacher of the Year.

The chapter supports the Willamette Valley Honor Flight, Florence Food Share and the Food Backpack for Kids program.

In addition to participating

in the annual Veterans Day Parade, members participate in the Flag Retirement Ceremony and catalogued the bricks at the Veterans Memorial Wall.

The Remembrance Garden at the Oregon Coast Military Museum was created as a result of the chapter-sponsored \$10,000 Special Projects Grant through the national club.

Several books have been donated to the Siuslaw Public Library, including the three-volume set "America's Women in the Revolutionary Era 1760-1790: A History Through Bibliography," and the chapter's cookbook, "DAR: Delicious Ancestral Recipes."

For more than a century, the members of the National

Society Daughters of the American Revolution have dedicated themselves to historical preservation, promotion of education and encouragement of patriotic endeavor. These timeless, overarching principles keep the DAR strong and vitally relevant in this ever-changing world.

Any woman 18 years or older, regardless of race, religion or ethnic background, who can prove lineal descent from a patriot of the American Revolution is eligible for DAR membership.
