Sailors land solid performance at MWL meet

Members of Mapleton’s track team were on the road at McKenzie High School last Friday to compete in a seven-team Mountain West League meet, where the Sailors placed third overall and the Lady Sailors were sixth.

In the races, freshman JJ Neece started things off with a fourth-place finish in the 100-meter dash, clocking a time of 12.58. In the 200 meters, sophomore Nate Neece ran a personal record of 26.71 to place fourth, along with a PR for fellow sophomore Richy Gastelum at 27.33 for sixth place.

Nate Neece went on to take third place in the 400 meters in 1:02.73, and freshman Robert Burnett ran a PR in the 3,000-meter race to place fourth in 14:56.68.

Freshman Phillip Burnett provided the day’s first win for Mapleton after setting a PR in the 110 hurdles at 20.93.

The Sailors went on to complete a freshman sweep the 300-meter hurdles, with Jeremy bender finishing first (55.57), followed by Phillip Burnett (1:03.36) and Robert Burnett (1:04.91).

The team of Cole Spencer, JJ Neece, Jeremy Bender and Nate Neece took second in the long relay, coming in at 4:11.22.

In the field events, Nate Neece PRd at 33-11 for sixth place, and sophomore Dylan Rogers was 7th at 33-0.

Rogers went on to win the javelin with a personal best throw of 128-01.

Spencer nabbed the top finish in the high jump after clearing 5-6, with JJ Neece landing second at 5-4.

Lowell won the boys team title with 147 points. Triangle Lake scored 122 points for second place, followed by Mapleton (111), Oak Hill (53), Alsea (38), McKenzie (22) and Siletz Valley (20).

For the girls, freshman Emily Stevens had the Lady Sailors’ only win on the day, clearing the 100-meter hurdles in 21.98.

Stevens also had a second-place finish in the 100-meter dash with a PR time of 14.88, and was a member of the fourth-place 4x100 relay team with Kaleigh Anderson, Trinity Holmes and Daleena Bender (1:03.98.)

Holmes, a sophomore, ran a PR in the 800 meters (3:02.60) for second place. Bender, a sophomore, ran a PR time of 16.77 in the 100 meters for sixth.

In the field events, Holmes landed a PR in the shot at 20-03 for seventh place, and Stevens cleared 12-1.5 for second place in the long jump.

Thursday, the Mapleton track team will compete at Monroe High School. First event begins at 4 p.m.

The Sailors will compete at home Tuesday, May 1, beginning at 4 p.m.

Vik tracksters land school records

It was a busy weekend for the Siuslaw track and field team, first hosting the multi-team Central Coast Invitational, then with a road trip to Gresham for the elite 54th annual Centennial Invitational.

Friday, Siuslaw’s premier invitation-al saw sophomore Hannah Rannow run the fifth-fastest 800-meter time in school history with a time of 2 minutes, 21.98 seconds to claim the win and a personal record. The, the following day in Gresham, Rannow ran the 3000-meter race in 10:29.29 for a PR, sixth place among the state’s elite runners in the event — not to mention the fourth-fastest girls time in Siuslaw history.

Katy Potter still holds the record at 10:09.22, with Celie Mans (10:17.77) and Morgan Bingham (10:25.70)

Siuslaw sophomore Ryan Rendon-Padilla landed the fifth-best IAAF javelin throw in Siuslaw history with a mark of 167-10 last week.

BEST BETS FOR FISHING

Spring can offer some of the best fishing of the year, with almost unlimited possibilities. Here are some highlights from this week’s Recreation Report.

• Dozens of waterbodies throughout the state have been stocked with thousands of trout. And it will only get better.

• If rivers and streams float your boat, the warming spring temperatures, and increased insect hatch- es are putting trout on the bite.

• It’s not too late to get your spring Chinook. In fact, several fisheries are just heating up. Check out the Columbia above Bonneville Dam and the lower Rogue. Or, be the first to report catching a springer in the Nestucca or Tillamook bays.

• It’s getting warm enough for warmwater fish. There’s largemouth bass in Lost River, crappie in Gerber and Campbell reser- voirs, and the elusive striped bass in the Smith River.
