City services utility bills to be delayed until May 5

The City of Florence is currently updating its water-meters throughout the city to a radio frequency based automatic meter reading system. As it proceeds with this upgrade, city staff have been reviewing each individual account to ensure that the new system is reading the meters correctly. This process has caused a delay in mailing out the May city services billings. City finance and public works staff are working with its vendors to begin mailing

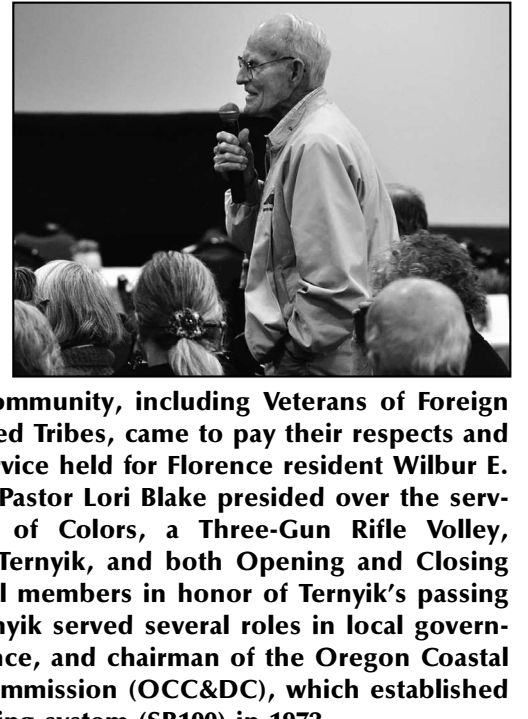
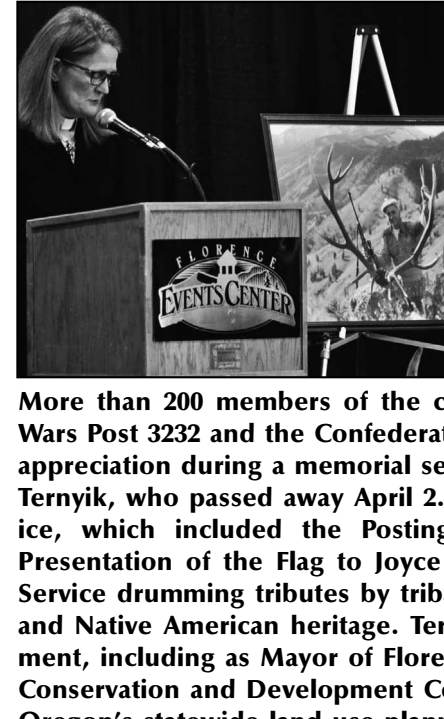
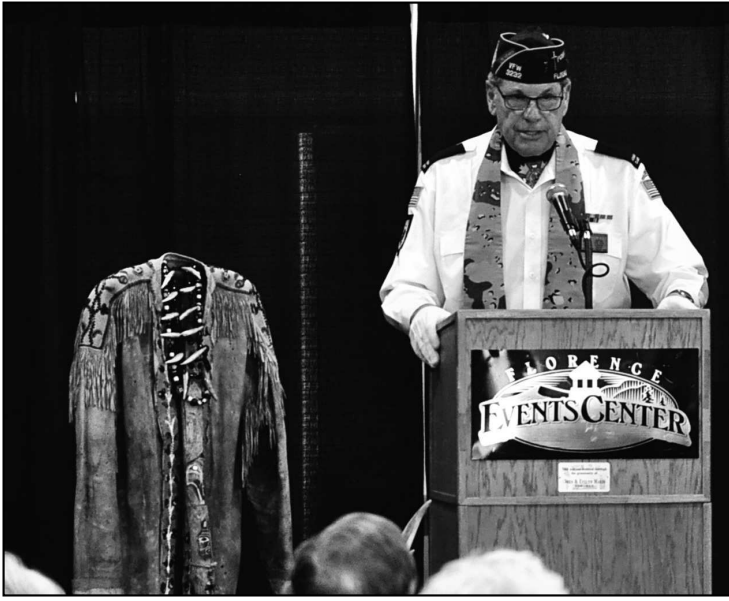

More than 200 members of the community, including Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3232 and the Confederated Tribes, came to pay their respects and appreciation during a memorial service held for Florence resident Wilbur E. Ternyik, who passed away April 2. Pastor Lori Blake presided over the service, which included the Posting of Colors, a Three-Gun Rifle Volley, Presentation of the Flag to Joyce Ternyik, and both Opening and Closing Service drumming tributes by tribal members in honor of Ternyik's passing and Native American heritage. Ternyik served several roles in local government, including as Mayor of Florence, and chairman of the Oregon Coastal Conservation and Development Commission (OCC&DC), which established Oregon's statewide land use planning system (SB100) in 1973.

Dela Mora family to host scholarship taco feed May 6

The Dela Mora family has announced that they are continuing to offer a scholarship in honor of their son, Jose Dela Mora, and will be hosting a taco feed to support the fund on Sunday, May 6, starting at noon. The taco feed is being cooked by the Dela Moras, who own and operate Rosa's Mexican Restaurant, 2825 Highway 101, and will be held on May 6 from noon until they sell out.

People will be able to buy six tacos for \$10. This is a great after church meal for families who can eat in or grab their tacos and take with them. The feed will be held at Crossroads Church at 1380 10th St., diagonal from the Siuslaw Public Library. The Jose Dela Mora scholarship was established in the spring of 2016, the year Jose Dela Mora was to have graduated from Siuslaw High

School. The scholarship was established to honor Jose's life and to memorialize the lives that he touched. Jose was tragically taken from this earth in a drowning accident. He was a gifted wrestler and a talented artist. However, he was most known for his fun-loving character and kindness. Everyone considered Jose their friend. Scholarships will be offered annually to students who have a passion for art or for

wrestling and who need support to pursue enrichment opportunities, college or vocational training.
