Trout fishing in streams and river open on May 22. Fishing is restricted to artificial flies and lures, May 22- Aug 31.

SILETZ RIVER: Steelhead, spring Chinook, cutthroat trout

Summer steelhead are in the river. Fishing is slow but will

improve over the coming weeks. The river is in good condition. Casting spinners, drifting bait or using a bobber and jig can be effective.

Spring Chinook are available in the Siletz. Be aware of the regulations for the Siletz, 1 wild Chinook per day and two for the season from April 1 – July 31.

Trout fishing in streams and river open on May 22.

(Note: The 3.5 mile bridge (aka Steel Bridge) in the Siletz gorge is now open to motorized vehicles, but is only open to public vehicles on the weekend.
