Candidates for office in Dunes City must be residents of Dunes City at the time of their election. Council seat positions are for a term of four years, while the mayor, a position currently filled by Bob Forsythe, is elected for a two-year term. Councilors whose terms expire at the end of this year include Duke Wells, Sheldon Meyer and Susan Snow.

So far, Meyer has submitted an application to run for re-election. Dunes City election packets are available for pickup at Dunes City Hall between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Completed applications must be submitted to the elections officer for release of petition signature pages.
