#### **BOOK REVIEW** "THE MAZE AT WINDERMERE" BY GREGORY BLAKE SMITH

When a drunken party guest challenges him to a late-night tennis match, Sandy Allison finds himself unexpectedly entangled in the moneyed world of Newport, RI.

A former touring pro a little down on his luck, Sandy has nothing to stake against the vintage motorcycle his opponent wagers. But then Alice DuPont — the young heiress to a Newport mansion called Windermere — offers up her diamond necklace.

With this reckless wager be- od. gins a dazzling narrative odyssey that braids together four centuries of aspiration and adversity in this renowned seaside society capital.

A witty and urbane bachelor of the Gilded Age embarks on a high-risk scheme to marry into a fortune; a young writer soon to make his mark turns himself to his craft with harrowing social consequences; an aristocratic British officer carries on a courtship during the American Revolution that leads to murder; and, in Newport's earliest days, a tragically orphaned Quaker girl imagines a way forward for herself and the slave girl she has inherited.
