U.S. Coast Guard Rear Admiral Throop visits Station Siuslaw River

U.S. Coast Guard Rear Admiral David G. Throop, Commander of the 13th Coast Guard District, visited Station Siuslaw River on July 17 — his first visit since presiding over Florence's official Coast Guard City ceremony held last August.

He was accompanied by Master Chief Petty Officer Jason Wong, Command Master Chief of the 13th Coast Guard District. Throop conducted an all-hands meeting with station crew and command, covering relevant topics and exchanging important information.

He expressed appreciation returning to the Coast Guard City and was impressed with the continued relationship and mutual

support between the community and the Coast Guard.

He took time to answer individual concerns and address personal career goals of the crew. He also recognized DC3 Rylan Burum for a job well done with base housing improvements.

Availability and cost of local housing continues to be a serious issue for station members and their families.

After the meeting, Station Siuslaw River Officer-in-Charge Senior Chief Jay Nilles gave Throop and Wong a tour of Coast Guard housing, the station, boat house and assets.

Throop, headquartered in Seattle, is responsible for all Coast Guard operations throughout the Pacific Northwest, which includes protecting life and

The 13th District spans over the states of Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana, and includes more than 4,400 miles of coastline, 600 miles of inland waterways and a 125 nautical mile international border with Canada.
