and Mapleton. Currently, nearly 100 school children receive three meals for Saturday and three meals for Sunday.

Volunteers purchase, store and pack food bags that are discretely distributed through school staff on Fridays.

The Cross Road Assembly of God underwrites the program with donations used to purchase the food.
