"It's much more than purely aesthetic," said ODOT Public Information Officer Angela Beers Sevdel. "It's safer not only for the folks walking along the bridge because it's higher ... but it's structurally more sound for cars that might hit it."

Lastly, pedestrian access and sidewalk improvements will consist of ramps and easier approaches to the bridge's sidewalks on both ends when construction is completed.

Final cost estimates for the project are roughly \$17.5 million, with about 90 percent funded federally and the rest by


