Ray Brown to talk about 'Walk Across America'

Former teacher Ray Brown will be at the Siuslaw Public Library on Saturday, Sept. 15, beginning at 1 p.m. in the Bromley Room.

Brown will describe his experiences walking across the United States, as well as sharing his passion for the Constitution and American History

Thirteen years ago, after observing what he perceived to be a steady erosion of civil liberties, Brown felt a calling to educate the American public and stimulate interest in the Constitution, the Bill of Rights, and the study of our nation's history

Brown, a retired Bethel School District teacher, has now given more than 7,000 copies of the Bill of Rights, established a "Bill of Rights" scholarship for students, and has performed annually at 4th of July festivities, including at Mount Rushmore National Park.

As a part of his mission to promote the study of American history and the Constitution,

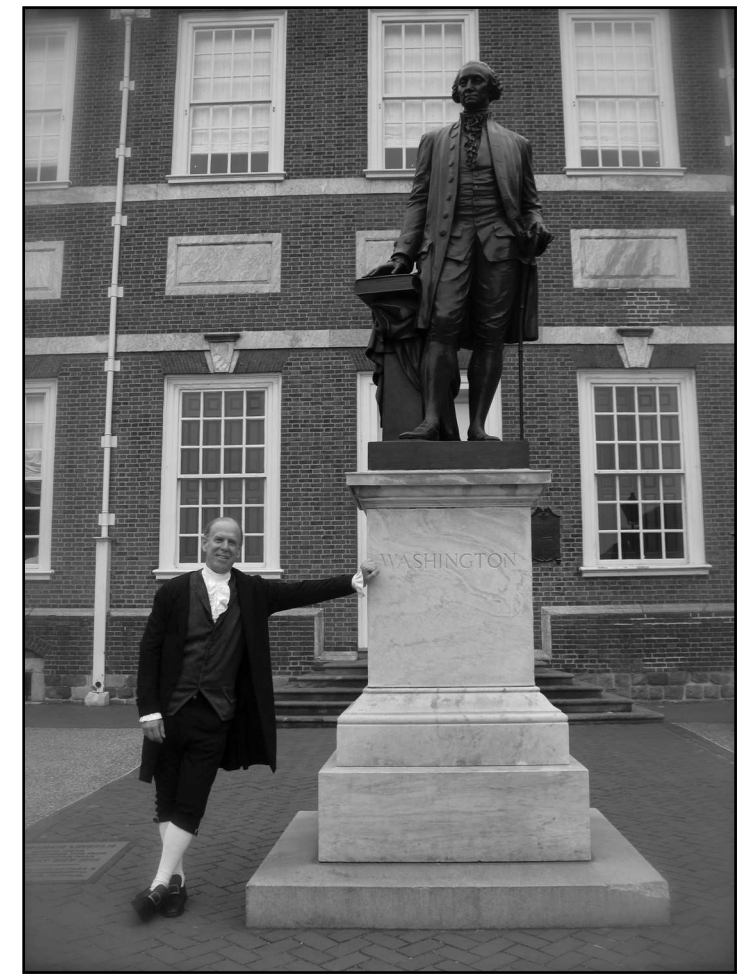
Brown dresses in period correct historical attire while sharing his love and passion with fellow citizens.

Brown continues to be best known for his Walk Across America. The walk began when he retired in 2010, when he started the 3,200-mile walk in Florence and ended in Atlantic City, N.J., walking across deserts and over mountains and following along much of yesterday's Oregon Trail.

The presentation at the Library by "A Son of Liberty," as Ray Brown is nicknamed, is sure to entertain and enhance or remind members of the audience about the importance of our Constitution and history.

This free event is open to the public and will appeal to everyone interested in the Constitution, American history, and/or the stories of Ray Brown's walk across America.
