CELEBRATE THE U.S. CONSTITUTION

Joel Marks, retired adjunct professor of American history who taught at Southern Oregon University, will present a program for the Oregon Dunes Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) meeting on Friday, Sept. 28.

In 1955, DAR petitioned Congress to set aside Sept. 17 to 23 annually to be dedicated for the observance of Constitution Week. The resolution was later adopted by the U.S. Congress and signed into public law on Aug. 2, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

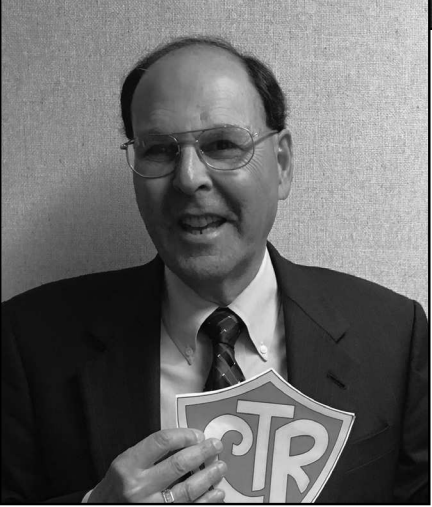
Oregon Dunes Chapter welcomes Marks' program about this most important document.

In recognition of Constitution Week, the Oregon Dunes Chapter has a month-

long annual display at Siuslaw Public Library. The chapter also receives a proclamation from the City of Florence to honor this most important week. This year's proclamation was presented at the Sept. 17 meeting of the Florence City Council.

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RAIN seeks applicants for Business Accelerator Program

Oregon RAIN (Regional Accelerator & Innovation Network) is seeking applicants for its Coastal Pre-Accelerator that starts on Wednesday, Oct. 17. The 10-week program offers hands-on training and mentorship to entrepreneurs and business owners in and around Florence.

The Coastal Pre-Accelerator is designed to teach entrepreneurs how to acquire more customers, develop a sales strategy, secure capital, find a mentor and more.

The Coastal Pre-Accelerator runs from Oct. 17 to Dec. 19.

The cohort will meet from 5 to 8 p.m. each Wednesday at Oregon Pacific Bank in Florence, 1355 Highway 101, for meetings with RAIN's Venture Catalyst David Youngentob, expert speakers, mentors and peers.

Drop-in guests will be welcome to listen to the guest speakers, with enrolled founders/companies staying for private mentoring.

There is no cost to participate in the Coastal Pre-Accelerator.

The application deadline is Friday, Sept. 28. Entrepreneurs

The Coastal Pre-Accelerator is tailored for startups that have already developed a product or service, but have not acquired many customers or raised any outside capital. However, entrepreneurs with a new idea are also encouraged to apply.

"The most important criteria for any applicant to the Coastal Pre-Accelerator is a commitment to growing your business," said Oregon RAIN Executive

Director Caroline Cummings. "Although established startups may be more familiar with the concepts, we'll consider any entrepreneur who's motivated to see their venture succeed."

Veteran groups organize POW/MIA event for Sept. 21

A national day of recognition for individuals that have served our country and are considered Prisoners of War (POW) or

Missing in Action (MIA) will be held on Friday, Sept. 21.

Observances of National POW/MIA Recognition Day are held across the country on military installations, ships at sea, state capitols, schools and veterans' facilities.

Observance of this day locally are being organized by veteran groups from American Legion Post 59, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3232 and The Band

of Brothers. The ceremony will be held at Veteran's Park on Bay Street in Historic Old Town Florence at 2 p.m.

The POW/MIA National Recognition Day is observed on the third Friday in September each year. This observance is one of six days throughout the year that Congress has mandated the flying of the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag. The others are Armed Forces Day,

Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day.

The flag is to be flown at major military installations, national cemeteries, all post offices, VA medical facilities, the World War II Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the official offices of the secretaries of state, defense and veterans' affairs, the director of the selective service system and the White House.
