also of Florence, fled the area in a white PT Cruiser headed eastbound on Highway 126 West.

The Lane County Sheriff's Office alerted law enforcement agencies south of Eugene and into California. A short time later, a Jackson County Sheriff's Office deputy spotted a PT Cruiser on Interstate 5, approximately 40 miles north of the Oregon-California border, that

matched the description of the vehicle in the stabbing incident.

Lucius was taken into custody by the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, assisted by the Oregon State Police and the Central Point Police Department, after spike strips were used to disable his vehicle on Interstate 5 just south of where he was first spotted.

Lucius was transported back to Eugene and lodged at the Lane County Jail on attempted murder, assault in the first de-

gree, and strangulation. Initial investigation indicates that the victim and suspect knew each other, but the details of what led to the stabbing are still being determined as of press time.

"The Lane County Sheriff's Office would like to thank all of the agencies that assisted, including the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, the Oregon State Police, the Central Point Police Department, the Florence Police Department and all of the agencies that kept a

watchful eye for the suspect and his vehicle prior to his capture," said Lane County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Sgt. Carrie Carver. "It is because of partnerships like these that the suspect was located and taken into custody so quickly."

The investigation is still ongoing as of press time Tuesday. Anyone with information about the above incident is asked to contact Lane County Detective Silano at 541-682-4312.

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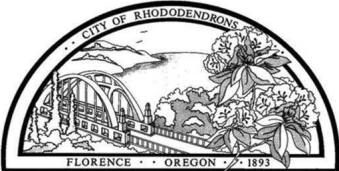

In recent years, U.S. President Donald Trump has stated his opposition to sanctuary jurisdictions — cities, counties or states that have enacted policies which limit the involvement of local officials in the enforcement of federal immigration law — and said that he would cancel all federal funding to them. On Jan. 25, 2017, Trump took his first action

against sanctuary jurisdictions by signing an executive order that would make them ineligible for federal grants and prioritize the deportation of individuals who pose a threat to public safety.

This Saturday, an interfaith march, coordinated by Quakers from the Willamette Valley, is marching in Florence in solidarity with the Rural Organizing Project and Oregon-based business owners that oppose

the passage of Measure 105.

Florence resident Nora Kent, who recently ran for a Lane County Board of Commissions position, is the point person for the Florence March for Immigrant Rights and she is encouraging like-minded citizens to attend.

"We are asking that communities of faith and other civic-minded folks join us in support of reuniting families, welcoming immigrants and refugees and releasing immigrants and asylum seekers who are detained in Oregon's Sheridan Prison and The Dalles' NORCOR (Northern Oregon Regional Correctional Facility) jail," Kent said.

According to Kent, organizers began planning the event before recent "Yes on Measure 105" political signs began appearing in the area.

"I think this march will send

an important message to the community that we recognize the need to protect and care about all about all of the people in this area and in the state," she said.

A number of major employers in Oregon are on record as opposing Measure 105, with Nike and Columbia Sportswear leading the fight against the passage of the measure.

Nike CEO Mark Parker recently wrote, "Nike employs people from all over the world; we can attest to the unique value, contributions and innovations that people from diverse backgrounds add to Nike and to Oregon's culture and economy. Ending Oregon's sanctuary law will damage Oregon's long-standing track record as a place that attracts diverse talent from across the globe."

Columbia CEO Tim Boyle also wrote in opposition to the measure.

"Oregon is enriched by our diversity, and immigrants living in Oregon are part of our families, communities, workplaces and places of worship. Measure 105 does not align with Oregon values," he said.

Two committees are registered to support Measure 105: the Repeal Oregon Sanctuary Law Committee (ROSLC) and the Parent's Education Association PAC. The ROSLC reported \$357,000 in contributions and \$355,587 in expenditures, including cash and in-kind donations. The largest donors include the Federation for American Immigration Reform (FAIR) and Oregonians for Immigration Reform. The Parent's Education Association PAC had not yet reported any campaign finance activity since it registered to support the measure on Sept. 26, 2018.

Four committees are registered to oppose Measure 105: Oregonians United Against Profiling, Oregonians for Sanctuary, Oregon Right to Health and Defend Oregon. In total, the opposition committees raised \$578,486 and spent \$61,860. The largest donors include the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), ACLU of Oregon, the Oregon Education Association and the National Immigration Law Center.

The Florence March for Immigrant Rights begins at 1:30 p.m. at the United Methodist Church of Florence, located at 333 Kingwood Avenue.

The Nov. 6 General Election features several measures and candidates for boards across Florence, the county and the state. Oct. 16 is the voter registration deadline and ballots will be mailed on Oct. 18. People should receive their Oregon Voter's Pamphlets starting Oct. 10.
