Confederated Tribes announce 2018-19 Charitable Giving Cycle

The Three Rivers Foundation, the giving arm of the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua & Siuslaw Indians has announced its next grant cycle will begin Dec. 1.

The Foundation, established in October 2011 and funded by proceeds from the Three Rivers Casino Resort in Florence, is interested in supporting innovative ideas, collaborative approaches and grassroots efforts in the following areas: education, health, public safety, problem gambling, the arts, the environment, cultural activities and historic preservation.

Interested parties are invited to review grant criteria and access an electronic application at the foundation's website at www.threeriversfoundation.org.

Grant applications for this giving cycle will be accepted from Dec. 1 through 5 p.m. on Dec. 31.

Nonprofit organizations with 501(c) (3) designations and government organizations located in Coos, Curry, Douglas, Lane or Lincoln Counties are encouraged to apply.

Additionally, applications from other Oregon nonprofit organizations with projects specifically important to Native American populations, projects that have "statewide impact" in Oregon, or other federally recognized tribes are also welcomed.

unique way. This project has helped raise their awareness of the needs of others and how they might assist in meet-ing those needs.

FRAA features Zentangle youth artist, mixed media artist

Florence Regional Arts Alliance (FRAA) is pleased to introduce the December Featured Youth Artist, Nathan Pfaff, as well as Featured Artist Elizabeth "Edie" Carhart.

Both artists will be featured at a reception at FRAA on Saturday, Dec. 8, during the Second Saturday Gallery Tour from 3 to 5 p.m.

The community is invited to come and meet these two talented artists, while enjoying holiday refreshments.

Pfaff is a 14-year-old ninth-grader who is home-schooled. He discovered his favorite medium one summer while doing yard work for a friend, who introduced him to a form of art called Zentangle.

This is basically a stress relieving form of drawing that uses repetitive patterns.

As Pfaff says, "When my friend told me about it, I was instantly hooked, and I have been doing it ever since. I have also started a Facebook page for Zentangle enthusiasts, which is called 'Florence Area Zentangles.'"

Pfaff's media of choice include Micron pens and Prismacolor pencils. He really enjoys using color.

"Zentangle provides me with a creative outlet that I hope others will enjoy as much as I do," he said.

Carhart was raised in Laguna Beach, Calif., which is a small town known as "The Artist Colony."

Graduating from high school with a Festival of Arts Scholarship Award, she then attended the University of Idaho. She graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in textiles and fibers, and a minor in Cultural Anthropology.

She also served as a member of the Peace Corps for two years in the Caribbean as an art teacher and Program Art Developer.

Carhart retired in 2005 from a career with the California and Montana State Parks and devoted her time to creating mixed media art with an emphasis on silk painting.

After retiring to Florence with her husband three years ago, she became a member of FRAA, where she displays her work, and serves as a volunteer.

"For me, art is a passion. The doing, the process ... is the thing," she said.

Carhart's artist signature is "Zabeth."
