- Scissors, needles, tweezers
- Popsicle sticks, splints, heavy string
- Thermometer, paper tape
- Syrup of Ipecac
- Personal prescription medications

City of Florence recruiting volunteers for openings on EMAC

Several of Florence's committees and commissions have open positions for area volunteers.

Sustaining and improving the City of Florence's livability and quality of life is Goal 2 of the City of Florence Work Plan. The Environmental Management Advisory Committee (EMAC) realizes Goal 2 by developing local strategies and advising Florence City Council on protecting the city's health and environment and conserving its energy and natural resources.

The committee is responsible for regulating the solid waste code, ensuring compliance with DEQ recycling education requirement and serving as the city's Tree Board.

EMAC is comprised of 11 citizen members and additional ex-officio non-voting members. The city is recruiting applicants to fill five openings for voting positions on the committee.

EMAC generally meets once per month as a group. Persons interested should expect to attend recurring meetings and

devote time for study of issues and performance above and beyond meeting attendance. Volunteer time is vital in working towards solutions to local government issues.

If you are interested in serving the Florence community and getting involved, consider applying for one of the open positions on EMAC. The deadline for applications is Dec. 31, so apply today. Positions are set to begin on Feb. 1, 2019.

Applying for a position is easy. Applications can be down-

loaded from the City's website at www.ci.florence.or.us and are available at the Florence Public Works Facility, 2675 Kingwood St., during regular business hours.
