Grants available for historic properties, archeology

The State Historic Preservation Office is offering grants for work on historic properties and for archaeology projects. The annual grants fund up to \$20,000 in matching funds for preservation projects.

The Preserving Oregon Grants fund the preservation of historic buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Work may include non-mainpreservation tenance win-dow repair, roof work, foundation projects, plumbing, and electrical needs.

The program also funds significant work contributing toward identifying, preserving and interpreting archaeological sites.

The Diamonds in the Rough Grants help restore or reconstruct the facades of buildings that have been heavily altered over the years.

These grants return buildings to their historic appearance and potentially qualify them for historic register designation (local or national).

The online grant application is simple to use and includes plenty of support. Free grant workshops on project planning, grant writing and using the online grant application will be available.

A workshop will be held in Salem on Tuesday, March 19, and a webinar workshop will be available on Friday, March 15.
