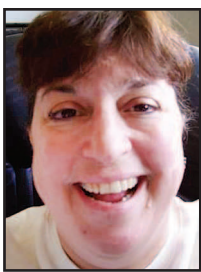

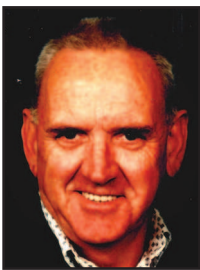

Avoid ‘distracted walking’: heads up, phones down

Distracted driving is a well-established problem; so much so, that many states including Oregon, currently have bans in place when it comes to using technology while driving. But the problem of distracted walking is a relatively new one. According to the most recent data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 5,977 pedestrians were killed and an estimated 85,000 injured in traffic collisions in the United States in 2017. That’s one death every 1.6 hours and an injury every 6 minutes. While it’s not clear how many of these are a direct result of distracted walking, the total rate of pedestrian fatalities compared to overall road deaths is increasing each year. The solution to distracted walking is a fairly simple one: do not use your cell phone or engage in other distracting activities while walking.

Take the lead in your own safety, and remember: Heads up, phones down.
