Sports and Money

In baseball, Siuslaw went scoreless and managed just two hits against Pirates senior Cam batters in a 6-0 shutout.


"While our defense didn't play great," Siuslaw coach Thomas Shinn said in reference to the team's seven errors, "it doesn't matter when you strike out 15 times."
