**HAGEN**—Wilhelm F. Hagen, 80, passed away at his home in Florence on Monday, March 18, 2019.

He was born Sept. 18, 1938, in Marktredwitz, Germany, to Karl and Anna Hagen.

He studied physics, married and immigrated to the United States in his 20s.

He lived with his family in Minnesota, Connecticut and California as job opportunities drew him to his work at Lawrence Livermore Laboratory designing laser systems.

He continued his work in particle physics after retiring and returned to Germany to start his own company building lasers.

He returned to the states and settled in Florence and worked on developing his own theory of particle

physics which he described as “Matter in the form of toroidal electromagnetic vortices (EM-vortices or Energiewirbel).”

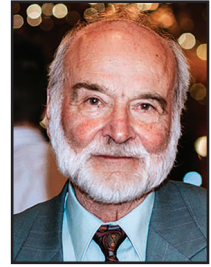
He later had the opportunity to acquire a parcel of land adjacent to his home and spent years working on designing and building his dream home.

Bill enjoyed being outdoors walking and enjoying nature, dancing and spending time with family and friends. He was generous and active in his community wherever he was.

He was laid to rest on his beloved home site in Florence.

## Voter registration deadline for May 21 election is Tuesday

The voter registration deadline for the May 21, 2019 Election is Tuesday, April 30. People who are not registered to vote in any Oregon county may register online at oregonvotes.gov no later than 11:59 p.m., Tuesday, April 30.

The online option is available only to those with a valid Oregon driver's license, DMV-issued identification card or learner's permit.

Other registration options:

- Submit a voter registration form to the Elections Office by 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, April 30.

- Mail a voter registration card to the Elections Office with a postmark no later than Tuesday, April 30.

New voters who will turn 18 on or before the May 21 Special Election Day may register by the April 30 deadline and receive a ballot, even if they are still 17 on the deadline date.

The Lincoln Street ballot

drop box at Lane County Elections will be open now through Tuesday, April 30, at 5 p.m., to make it easier for voters to drop off completed registration cards.

“We are opening the drop box to accommodate Lane County citizens who may not be able to come to our office during regular business hours,” said Lane County Clerk Cheryl Betschart.

Lane County Elections is located at 275 W. 10th Ave., on the corner of 10th and Lincoln streets in downtown Eugene.

Public office hours are 9 a.m. to noon, and 1 to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday.

On Election Day, May 21, the Lane County Elections Office will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

## Florence Police to participate in National Drug Take Back Day

The Lane County Sheriff's Office is partnering with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) to help residents safely dispose of prescription drugs while educating the community about the potential for abuse of medications.

This is a no-questions-asked prescription drug drop off in effort to prevent the unsafe disposal of medications, and to prevent medications from being stolen or abused.

At the 16th Annual Na-

tional Take Back Day in October of last year, 914,236 pounds of medications were collected at 5,839 sites nationwide. Help in the fight against prescription drug addiction and check your medicine cabinet for prescription drugs that are expired or that you no longer use so they can be safely disposed.

Bring your unwanted and expired prescription and over-the-counter medications to the Florence Justice Center, 900 Greenwood St., in Florence on Saturday,

April 27, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Acceptable items include: Prescription medications, over-the-counter medications, vitamins, drug samples, pet medications, ointments, lotions, and liquid medicines in glass or leak proof containers.

Items unable to be accepted are: Needles, thermometers, bloody or infectious waste, medications from businesses, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, inhalers and diabetic meters.

For anyone who is unable to attend the Drug Take Back Event with medications they would like to dispose of, the Lane County Sheriff's Office has a Drug Drop Box located in its Central Reception lobby in the Lane County Courthouse available to accept medications (no appointment necessary) Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., excluding legal holidays.
