Jon Thompson named new board chairman of OPB

Greg Wood will speak about First Step's transitional housing project. Eric Hauptman of Heart of the Coast Housing Alliance presents its

vision for the manufacture of ADUs (Accessory Dwelling Units) and the issues such homes can help remedy.

Suzanne Mann-Heintz of Safe Shelter for Siuslaw Students shares plans in the works for temporary emergency housing for students and their families and the impact of insufficient housing on student performance.

The May monthly FACC meeting will be held Wednesday, May 1, from 9 to 10:30

a.m., in the Bromley Room of the Siuslaw Public Library. FACC hosts meetings with topics of community interest each month to encourage community participation and networking.

In addition to the housing panel, FACC will hold its monthly business meeting. This month, the FACC Board will present its slate of candidates for board positions and take nominations from the floor.

The annual election of board members happens at the June 5 meeting.
