

• Anyone - not just law enforcement - may enter a motor vehicle, "by force or otherwise," to remove an unattended child or domestic animal without fear of criminal or civil liability, as long as certain requirements are met.

The full text of Oregon's "Good Samaritan" law can be found under ORS 30.813.
