Experts on fire ecology, management to speak today

The Siuslaw Watershed Council will present a presentation on forest fire ecology, management and prevention on June 26 at the Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue (SVFR) Station, located at 2625 Highway 101.

Dan Gavin, Professor of Geography with the University of Oregon, will talk about biogeography, fire and natural disturbance history.

Maija Corliss, with the Bureau of Land Management, will discuss forest fire management by the BLM and the U.S. Forest Service.

Tony Miller, Fire Prevention Officer for SVFR, will speak on prevention and defensible space strategies.

The presentation will be from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. and is free to the public.

WLCF Continuing Education Scholarships deadline nears

Western Lane Community Foundation (WLCF) has announced its fifth annual Continuing Education Scholarships program for 2019, offering 16 scholarships totaling \$18,500.

These scholarships are awarded annually and are designed for students who use permanent home addresses within the Florence, Dunes City, Mapleton and Deadwood geographical areas. The scholarships

are for those who have already graduated from high school, have their diploma, GED or were home schooled and are eligible to enter higher education, a trade school or a graduate program.

This includes non-traditional students starting or returning to a program after a career, family change or job loss.

Scholarships are available for traditional four-year

universities, colleges, community colleges, accredited trade schools and special arts programs. While academic achievement is one criteria used in determining recipients, other qualifying characteristics include financial need, outside activities, work history and volunteerism.

The application lists criteria specific to each scholarship.

Those who meet these

minimum qualifications are encouraged to complete an application, which can be obtained at Lane Community College Florence Center or on the WLCF website at www.wlcfonline.org.

Application packets may be submitted online or by mail to PO Box 1589, Florence, Ore. 97439.

The deadline for postmark or receipt is June 30.

Latest 'BE the Whale' art scholarship winner announced

River Gallery owner and TR Hunter Realtor Jan Jagoe recently awarded Aspen Shih from Highland Park High School in Lone Tree, Colo., a \$1,000 art scholarship for her colored pencil drawing of the endangered black-footed ferret.

Jagoe created the "BE the Whale" project for the dual purpose of raising awareness of endangered species nationwide and rewarding high school art students for their participation in the project.

High school students from Wyoming will submit their artwork of an endangered animal during the spring semester of 2020.

Jagoe previously awarded \$1,000 art scholarships to students in California, Washington, Nevada, Arizona, Utah, Idaho, Oregon, Montana and New Mexico.

The Siuslaw School District receives 10 percent of the funding garnered through the "BE the Whale" GoFundMe account. The funds will be distributed to classroom teachers and staff to buy much needed classroom supplies.

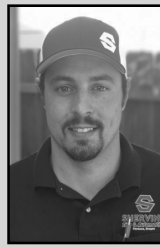
