ARMSTRONG 'TAKES OVER' THIRD AT BOX CAR

Driving his 2019 Yamaha YXZ1000 UTV race car, local sand drag racer Gary "G" Armstrong battled his way into the semi-finals and a third-place finish at the annual UTV Takeover Side by Side Wars at Box Car Dunes in North Bend last weekend.

This year's event drew an estimated 20,000 UTV enthusiasts to the Oregon Dunes for a week of camping, recreational riding and sand competitions. UTV's also called "side by sides"

because they can accommodate up to four people — are a fairly new breed of 4-wheeled recreational vehicle that have become increasingly popular due to their car-like characteristics, safety and handling.

UTV Takeover hosts four similar events in the U.S. each year.

Armstrong, of Florence, will compete in the Albany Sand Drags this weekend to qualify for the NW Pro Car Sand Drag Championship Race Series, where he is currently tied for fourth place in the standings.

(Editor's Note: In Part II of our look at the exponential growth of Sandboarding in South America and, most recently, Saudi Arabia, we talk with Sand Master Park owner and sandboarding guru Lon Beale who, in addition to relocating his park next to Fred Meyer, will soon be working as a consultant to establish a multi-million dollar sandboarding park in Saudi Arabia.)

Then they have a sandboarding tournament event, there's 100 competitiors. When we have an event here in the U.S., there's 20 competitors. tricks they're doing on snow, they're doing on sand now."

As to why Americans don't want to compete, Beale called it "the question of the day."

"We live in Florence. There

MID-COAST LAKES

Stocking of the mid-coast lakes began the first week of February and will continue into June. Check the stocking schedule online for dates and locations of stockings. These early stockings include: Alder and Dune Lake, Cleawox, Lost Lake, Munsel Lake, Thissel Pond, Mercer Lake, Big Creek Reservoirs, Ollala Reservoir and Devils Lake.

Warmwater fisheries are improving in several lakes around the Florence area including: Siltcoos, Tahkenitch, Mercer, and Munsel.

SILTCOOS & TAHKENITCH LAKES:

Warmwater species Warmwater fishing has

been improving on Siltcoos and Tahkenitch lakes. The recent warm weather is warming up the water and getting the fish more active. We are now in the post spawn time of year, fish will start to move out the shallows and disperse throughout the lakes into a variety of habitats. Warmwater fishing will continue to be good through the summer and into the fall.

Siltcoos also gets stocked rainbow trout, check the stocking schedule for numbers and dates of stockings.

SIUSLAW RIVER:

SILETZ RIVER: Summer steelhead, spring Chinook, cutthroat trout

The Siletz River is open year-round for steelhead and summer steelhead fishing has been slow so far this season but should improve towards the end of June and the early part of July. Anglers are catching summer steelhead throughout the system but the best fishing is in the Moonshine and gorge areas. The summer steelhead fishery picks up in May and peaks in June and July.

Fishing peaks mid-June through August and then continues to produce fish until the heavy rains come in the
