the state play-offs - including a state championship in 2006. Since Coach Dodson retired teaching and coaching, the program has had two different coaches from different football back-grounds.

As qualified as these coaches may have been, they lacked Viking player experience.

The selection of Sam Johnson as the new head football coach for the Siuslaw Vikings rekindles the Viking player-to-Viking coach connection.

Coach Johnson may be young in years but he has years of Viking blood: He could be seen on the sidelines as an elementary age ball boy; his father has been a Viking assistant coach at various levels; young Sam and his brother, John, would run dry footballs to the officials during home football games.

This early and close proximity to Coach Dodson and his staff could only have contributed to his game day knowledge about the intensity and efforts given by those coaches. Our Coach Johnson also

comes from a family of football coaches. Adding to the experience of his father as a coach are two uncles. They each happen to have been in charge of the 6A Sheldon Irish, with each winning at least one state championship. Coach Johnson's dad

remarked to me a quote from his son about Florence when he said, "Oak Street for Life." This refers to the entire educational and sports arenas, which are located on Oak Street.

Coach Johnson was educated there, played his ath-

letics there — and now he will be coaching and teaching on Oak Street.

There are challenges ahead to be sure. The Vikings are heading into another season with their fourth coach in five years; this comes after having just two coaches in the previous 45 years with Lutero and Dodson.

Also, the student body is smaller. And the league they are competing in at the 3A level is one of the toughest in the state. The players need to know Coach Johnson and his staff will work tirelessly to instill Viking Pride. It is a pride that comes from being the hardest working football team in the state, at any level.
