NOTE: Temporary regs for wild Chinook in coastal rivers - Due to low forecasted returns this year, wild Chinook fishing will be restricted in most coastal rivers. Most of these temporary regulations will be in effect from Aug. 1-Dec. 31, though a few don't start until Sept. 16 or Oct. 1.

Before planning your fishing trip, be sure the check the regulation updates.

MID COAST LAKES:

Stocking of the mid-coast ended Warmwater fisheries are improving in several lakes around the Florence area including Siltcoos, Tahkenitch, Mercer and Munsel lakes.

SILTCOOS TAHKENITCH LAKES:

Warmwater species

Warmwater fishing has been good on Siltcoos Tahkenitch lakes as well as many other lakes in the Florence area. Water temperatures are warm and fish can be found throughout the lake in a variety of habitats. Warmwater fishing will continue to be good through the summer and into the fall.

Rannow cards tough round at PGA's Champions Tour event

After qualifying for last week's Boeing Classic on the PGA's Championship Tour, Ocean Dunes golf pro Bob Rannow finsihed the three-day classic by shooting an 80 in his final-round on Sunday.

Rannow, 50, wrapped up his first appearance in the Tournament of Champions at 24-over-par and in last place at Snowqualmie Ridge in Snowqualmie, Wash.

En route to qualifying for the tour, Rannow sank five bird-



ies, 11 pars and two bogeys

for his round in the qualifier two weeks ago, posting a 3-under-par 68 and to land the day's Pernice Jr., who shot a 15-unbest score out 47 golfers in the prequalifying round.

Rannow was among the five golfers who had advanced into the classic in Washington. In his final round, Rannow-

had a birdie, a double bogey, seven bogeys was par on nine wholes.

Brandt Jobe carded a 63 in the final round, finishing with an 18-under-par 198 to nab a \$315,000 first-prize purse.

Finishing second was Tom

der-par, and third place went to Jerry Kelly and Fred Couples in a tie at 12-under-par each.

Rannow, who earned \$1,302, shot 82-78-80-240 for a threeday total score, placing 75th and among all finishers in a field of 78 — three of which did not finish; Fred Funk left in the second round, Dudley Hart left in the third round, and John Daly opted out after the first round of tournament play.
