Trumpeter Bobby Medina fronts this exciting group of musicians that faithfully replicate the sound and spirit of the popular Tijuana Brass. Proceeds from "Harvest for Education" go to support scholarships for girls and women in the Siuslaw region, including graduating high school seniors and women pursuing educational opportunities.

Every year, Soroptimist International distributes more than \$2 million in education grants to about 1,500 women all over the world and over \$30,000 was awarded in 2019 to eight local seniors from Siuslaw and Mapleton High School. Hear from award-winning wildlife photographer, author Sept. 26

Join David Moskowitz, photographer and author of the award-winning book "Caribou Rainforest: From

Heartbreak to Hope" and producer of the film "Last Stand: The Vanishing Caribou Rainforest," at Siuslaw Public Library for a night of images and stories from one of the world's most unique terrestrial ecosystems. The presentation will take place on Thursday, Sept. 26, beginning at 6 p.m. in the Bromley Room at 1460 Ninth St.

Found in the northern interior of the Pacific Northwest, the Caribou Rainforest is the only remaining inland temperate rain forest

on Planet Earth and home to one of the world's most unique ecotypes of caribou.

Moskowitz will focus his presentation on the efforts required to get his photographs while exploring the highlights, challenges, ethics of documenting a vanishing species in a remote rain forest and the widely different human cultures that call the region home.

Over four years, Moskowitz has captured images and recorded video in every season of the year in the Caribou Rainforest.

bou Rainforest. From backcountry ski expeditions to multi-day canoe excursions, to camera trapping in remote mountain valleys, he sought ways to capture the images that would tell the both inspiring and heartbreaking story of a vanishing ecosystem.

Along the way, he has joined researchers, loggers, conservationists and First Nations wildlife stewards and activists.

Genealogy Society heads to Pioneer Museum today

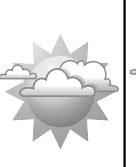
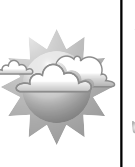
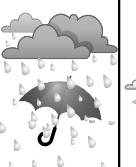
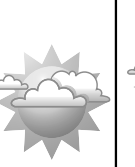
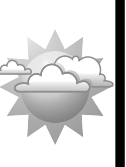
Members of the Siuslaw Pioneer Museum volunteer staff and the John Quay Heritage Players will inform and delight members of the Siuslaw Genealogy Society
