Oregon Dues Chapter of DAR welcomes new member

Carol Eatherton Slaugh has known for years that her ancestors came from Europe, or other countries, just like every other American, with the exception of the Native Americans.

At 17, she married her husband Richard, who had already served four years in the Air Force. After 21 years and four children, they retired to civilian life with gratitude for their experiences and the education given to their family.

Slaugh said curiosity about her roots set in she read frequent articles about the Oregon Dunes DAR chapter in the Siuslaw News.

Meeting chapter registrar Karen Childs provided the link to her long quest to explore her family's history. Remembering bits and pieces handed down from parents and grandparents started her digging into her family history.

Slaugh found that her ancestors, on both her maternal and paternal side, descended from founding

fathers who came to America and helped form or join colonies as early as the 1600s.

Discovering true pioneers was so much more gratifying than she ever expected, said Slaugh, who even found family marriages to famous people who made important historical marks in our country.

Childs helped her complete her application, which was approved in June of

this year. Slaugh said it was a long summer, anticipating her induction into Oregon Dunes DAR Chapter.

When contacted to schedule her installation at the September meeting, she wrote: "I am definitely prepared for my induction! I have waited all summer, as this is a big event for me. I know that all my grandparent's ancestors struggled and worked diligently to help found our country,

some under terrible conditions during the Revolution.

"Honoring them with my DAR involvement and recognizing them as Patriots is very special to me and my family."

Slaugh was installed at the Sept. 27 meeting and brought four hand-quilted lap blankets that will be donated to Roseburg Veterans Hospital. In addition to becoming a member of the DAR, Slaugh contributes countless hours to the Minutes of Gold and the New Life Lutheran Church program that provides quilts around the world.

DAR was founded in 1890 and established in Oregon in 1896. As a non-political, lineage organization, its mission is to promote historic preservation, encourage education and celebrate patriotism through service to veterans and active duty military personnel.
