Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation lends support to SOS

On Tuesday, Jan. 14, in Canyonville, Ore., the Cow Creek Umpqua Indian Foundation (CCUIF) awarded \$474,650 to 70 nonprofit agencies. One of those agencies that received funds was Siuslaw Outreach Services (SOS).

SOS received \$10,000 to go toward emergency vouchers for shower, laundry, prescriptions, transportation, heating and water bills. The funds will also be used to provide rain gear for the homeless. Last year, SOS provided direct aid to over 3,000 individuals in some form of crisis.

The CCUIF was established in 1997. To date, the foundation has awarded \$18,980,024 to nonprofits in seven counties in southwest Oregon.

Foundation Executive Director Carma Mornarich said, "With its

Oregon and beyond." CCUIF awards are made separately from and in addition to regular philanthropic decisions made by the Cow Creek Tribal Board.

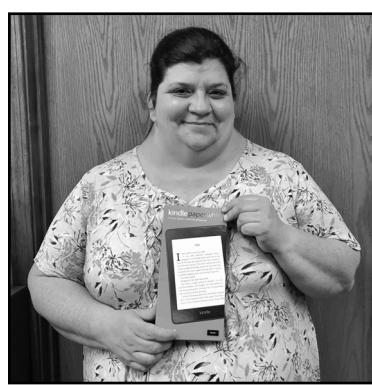
