DMV: What you need to know about Oregon's new 'Real ID'

Beginning Oct. 1 of this year, the Transportation Security Administration, (TSA) begins requiring a new type of identification to board a commercial aircraft.

The new ID must be compliant with something called the Real ID Act. It's designed to keep people safer in the air, but if someone tries to board an aircraft using their current Oregon driver license starting in

October, it won't work. That's because the current Oregon driver license is not Real ID compliant.

Oregon DMV will begin offering a Real ID option on July 6, 2020. To fulfill the demand of nearly 1 million Oregonians who will want the Real ID option, DMV would have to issue 32 licenses a second every business day from July to October.

That's just not possible.

If someone doesn't have a Real ID compliant form of ID at the airport, TSA will put them through an alternate identity verification process that could take an hour or more, and people may miss their flight.

There is another option for Oregonians, which is to obtain and use a passport or passport card.

The cost of getting a new passport card is roughly equal to that of getting a re-

placement license with the Real ID option — and people can apply now at one of over 76 acceptance sites across Oregon.

Siuslaw to host Student Success Act community forum Friday

If they would like to attend the afternoon session, they can drop in for lunch before the second session begins. Both sessions will cover the same topic.

Presentation to highlight benefits, challenges of 2020 census

Learn why the 2020 Census is important to the Siuslaw region at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 5, at the Florence Area Community Coalition meeting in the Bromley Room of the Siuslaw Public Library.

The meeting is open to the public.

"The Road to 2020," presented by Jim Graham, a partnership specialist with the 2020 U.S. Census, will focus on why we do a decennial Census and will support the critical message that the 2020 Census is safe, important and easy.

Graham will discuss the impact a Census has on our communities for the

next 10 years. The Census determines the distribution of more than \$700 billion annually in federal funds, which includes programs such as Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, Head Start, the National School Lunch Program, highway planning and construction, and more.

It also defines congressional and state legislative districts, school districts, voting precincts and determines the number of seats each state get in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Florence had one of the highest non-response rates for Lane County in the 2010 Census, with 13-15

percent of the population not being counted, according to the Lane Council of Governments.

Graham also will talk about the Census Partnership Program, which works with local governments and community organizations as we together strive to identify, reach, interview and/or persuade "Hard to Count" populations such as older adults, young children, people experiencing homelessness and rural communities to respond to the 2020 Census.

Finally, the critical importance of Census data and its role in statistics, grant funding and plan-

ning in both the public and private sectors will be discussed at a high level.

Graham is a Partnership Specialist with the 2020 U.S. Census supporting the Oregon Coast. His background is in senior living management, entrepreneurial business, and fruit fly genetics, in addition to years as a U.S. Navy sonar technician and Navy instructor.

The program is organized by the Florence Area Community Coalition in partnership with Siuslaw Vision.
