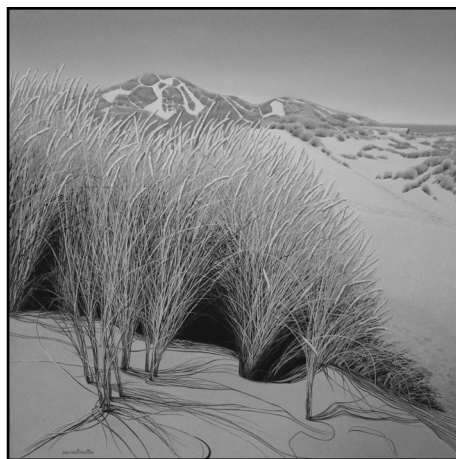

Backstreet announces ‘Where Art Thou?’ Winning Artists

Awards were announced at a reception on March 6. Ribbons were awarded in three categories: 2-D, 3-D and photography. Additional recognition went for the Best of Show Award and the People’s Choice Award.

In the 2-D category, Colleen Goodwin-Chronister won first place with her exquisite brand of realistic painting, “Hike Through the Dunes.”

Colleen is a passionate,

award-winning oil painter from Florence. She paints with a unique, contemporary approach to realism, a style she refers to as “magic realism.”

Mariann Maccinett took first place in the 3-D category with a unique mixed-media mosaic piece, “The Hat.”

She says, “I have been doing mosaic for about 17 years and hope to still be doing them for another 17.”

Amy Rickford received first place in photography by shooting the moment of a brilliant breaking wave called, “Edge of the Sea.” With an interest in photography for 15 years, Amy en-

joys capturing all kinds of subjects. Though, her favorites are macro and landscape photography. “Florence provides a wonder of inspiration.”

The People’s Choice Award went to Ed Larsen for a one-of-a-kind mixed-media piece executed in wood and metal entitled “Before the Breach.”

A retired teacher, Ed taught elementary and secondary subjects that included art and shop. He has been working with wood and metal since the 1970s.

Curt Peters, noted local photographer and owner of Digital Dunes Photography,

won the Best of Show ribbon with his vibrant avian photo, “Quetzal,” taken in a jungle setting of Costa Rica,

According to the Siuslaw Vision, the Nonprofit Association of Oregon and Washington Nonprofits are offering a free webinar on “COVID-19 — What Should Nonprofits Be Thinking About?” on Monday, March 16, at noon. As coronavirus spreads in the states of Washington, Oregon and beyond, what should nonprofits be thinking about and doing?

Presenter Laura Pierce, Executive Director of Washington Nonprofits, will provide an overview of some issues people need to be considering as they prepare to keep their nonprofit, staff and community safe, healthy and productive.

These include adapting to mandates to reduce gatherings and in-person work, business continuity planning and assessing financial impact.

The seminar will also discuss what type of leadership is called for during this time, and how to crowdsource ideas about how to move forward.

All sessions will be recorded and the recording will be available to all registered participants. Participants

who are unable to attend one or more of the sessions will still have access to all course materials.

Pierce has served as Washington Nonprofits’ executive director since 2016. Prior to joining the Washington Nonprofits team, she was an independent consultant to nonprofits for 18 years, assisting with strategic planning, board development, organizational assessment and capacity building.

She also served as an interim executive for 14 different Puget Sound nonprofits.

The Siuslaw Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society meeting on Tuesday, March 17, will feature Dr. Glen Jamieson.

Jamieson has explored the mountains of Yunnan, China; Borneo, Ecuador and Peru; and Sikkim, India, in search of those most elusive and beautiful plants.

Jamieson maintains a

beautiful garden which is toured frequently throughout the year. He also has an extensive collection of vireya rhododendrons, which grow in more temperate climates and are most often epiphytic (grow in trees).

This is the last meeting before the Rhododendron Early Flower Show at the Florence Events Center in April.

There will be information on how people can present their favorite flowers.
