The filing deadline for tax Businesses returns has been extended from April 15 to July 15.

The IRS urges taxpayers time must file who are owed a refund to file as quickly as possible. For those who can't file by the July 15 deadline, the IRS reminds individual taxpayers that everyone is eligible to request an extension to file their return.

This filing and payment relief includes:

The 2019 income tax filing and payment deadlines for all taxpayers who file and pay their Federal income taxes on April 15 are automatically extended until July 15. This relief applies to all individual returns, trusts and corporations. This relief is automatic; taxpayers do not need to file any additional forms or call the IRS to qualify.

This relief also includes estimated tax payments for tax year 2020 that are due on April 15.

Penalties and interest will begin to accrue on any remaining unpaid balances as of July 16, 2020. You will automatically avoid interest and penalties on the taxes paid by July 15.


