#### Public fire restrictions now in effect in Siuslaw National Forest

CORVALLIS-Even with the recent moisture, the trend of increasingly hot and dry weather has resulted in hazardous fire conditions on the Siuslaw National Forest.

In an effort to prevent human-caused wildland fires and to promote fire awareness, US Forest Service officials have instituted some public use fire restrictions across all areas of the Siuslaw National Forest.

Prohibitions include: · Campfires not con- Forest Service roads, extained within a pre-in- cept when parking in an stalled fire enclosure at an area devoid of vegetation official developed campsite. This excludes campfires within designated Dunes National Recreation sand camping areas on the Area and the Sand Lake Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area and dispersed camping within the Sand Lake Recreation Area. • Welding or operating a torch with an open flame.







Consistent with Section 12005 of the federal CARES mission (PSMFC) website Act, NOAA Fisheries allocated nearly \$16M to eligible Oregon businesses participating in marine and/ or anadromous fisheries. NOAA recently approved the Spend Plan, which allows the application period to begin.
