Oregon granted major disaster declaration for wildfires

Following an expedited individual assistance pro- area can begin applying for gonians know how to apply by Oregon Governor Kate Brown on Monday, Oregon was notified within 24 hours that federal emergency aid has been made available to the state to supplement state, tribal and local recovery efforts in the areas affected by wildfires and straight-line winds beginning on Sept. 7 and continuing.

"Oregon is resilient, but to fight fires on this scale, we need all the help we can get," said Governor Kate Brown. "I am grateful for the White House's swift response in quickly granting a Presidential Disaster Declaration and the immediate implementation of FEMA's

additional relief to Oregonians impacted by the devastation of these fires."

The declaration makes federal funding available to affected individuals in Clackamas, Douglas, Jackson, Klamath, Lane, Lincoln, Linn and Marion counties.

Assistance can include grants for temporary housing and home repairs, lowcost loans to cover uninsured property losses, and other programs to help individuals and business owners recover from the effects of the disaster.


